We don't know what it will look like, but if we love God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength, and our neighbor as ourselves we will be able to welcome all, love all and seek justice for all.

May we join with the Spirit and move into the future for our church with hope.

This is the seventh year that Zion has sponsored this ministry and our response has placed scores of tannenbaums in the homes of our military families to make their holidays a bit brighter.


